

It also provides a sequence of learning experiences related to the national Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) and repair categories requiring certification. This program may include diesel engine repair. Learning activities in the classroom, laboratory, shop, and actual wok setting are combined to provide students the the opportunity to become knowledgeable of nomenclature; safety principles and practices; and job entry level skills in disassembling, assembling, inspecting, repairing, and replacing components or systems.



Computer Programming






